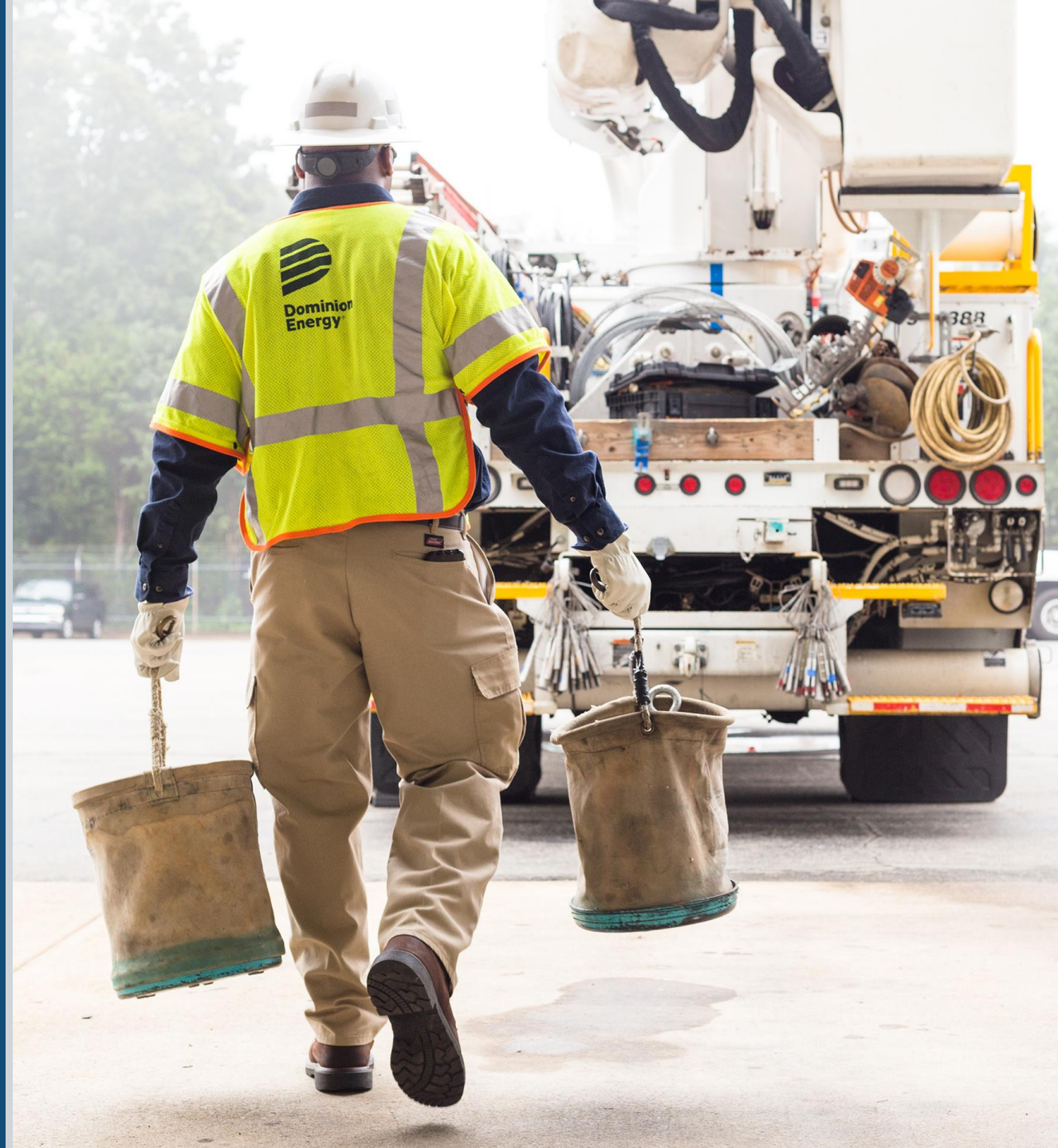




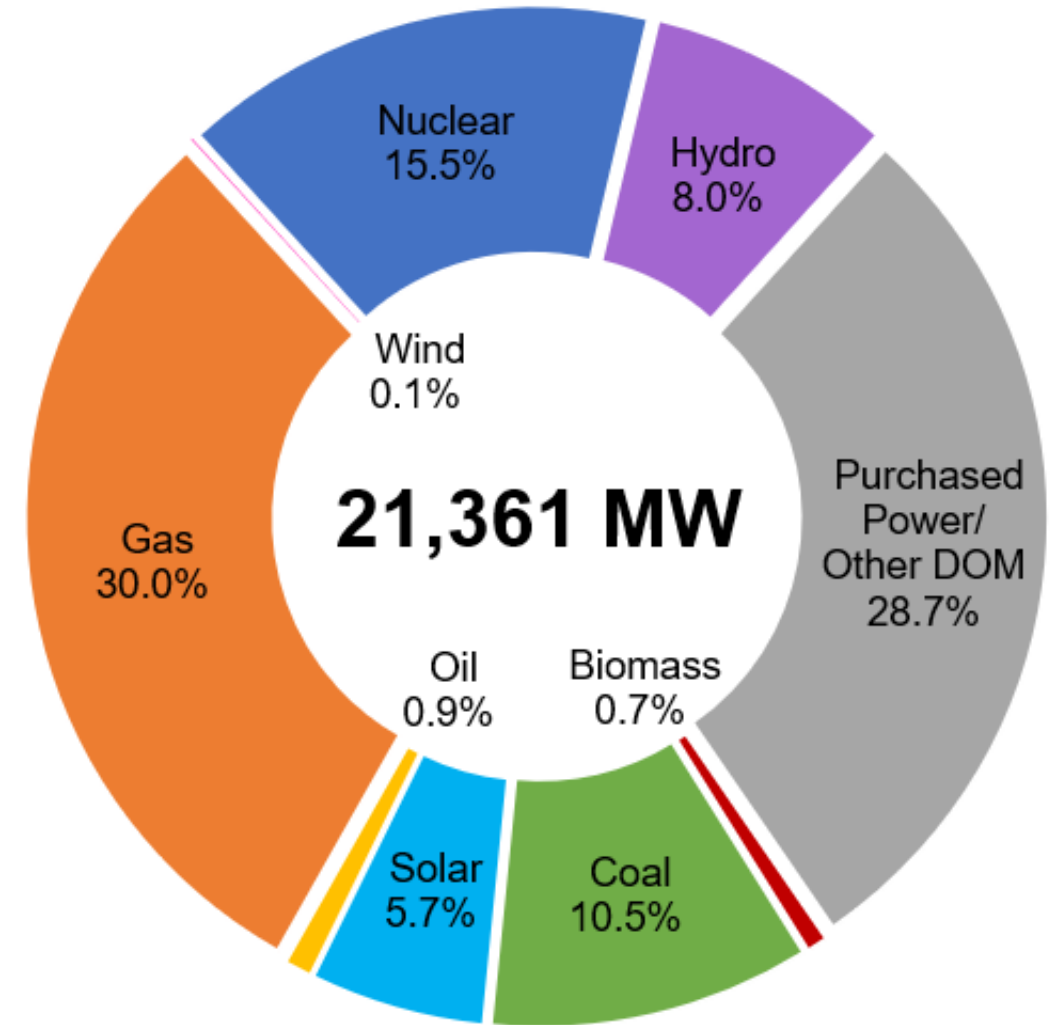

Dominion Energy Virginia 2024 Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) Stakeholder Process Overview

June 26, 2024



- Customer demand in the DOM Zone peaked at 21,361 MW
- All-time record remains 22,189 MW (Winter Storm Elliott, 12/24/22)
- Leveraged diverse resource portfolio to meet customers' needs

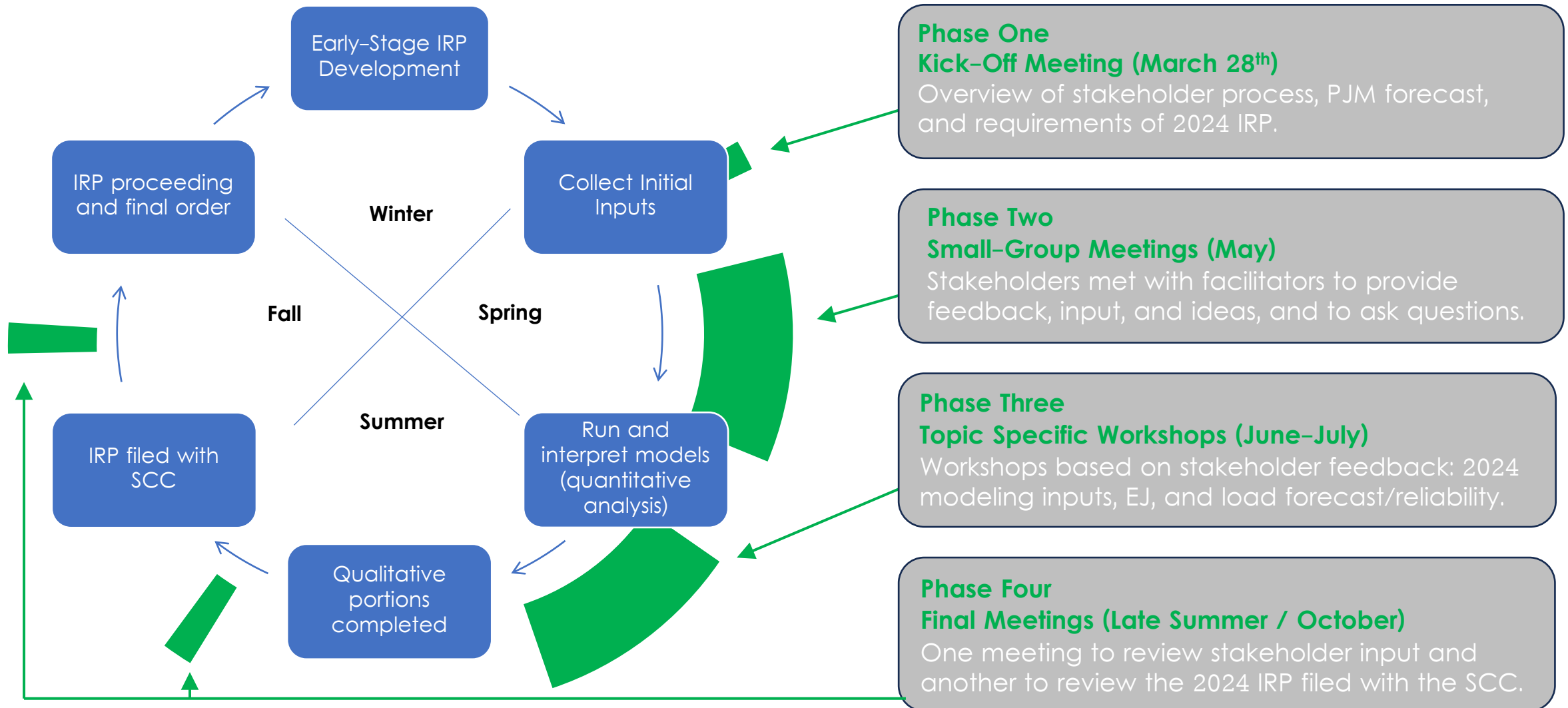


- Statute created in 2008—HB 1523 (Orrock) / SB 311 (Reynolds)
 - “[P]romote reasonable prices, reliable service, energy independence, and environmental responsibility.”
- Subsequent statutory changes:
 - Evaluation of distribution grid transformation projects; long-term plan for energy efficiency measures (2018)
 - Explicit consideration of energy storage to help meet demand forecast; long-term plan to integrate new energy storage (2020)
 - Retirement study for carbon-emitting facilities (2021)
 - Stakeholder review process and report (2023)
- Between statute and prior State Corporation Commission orders, now more than 100 requirements to be addressed in IRP filings

As part of preparing any integrated resource plan pursuant to this section, each utility shall conduct outreach to engage the public in a stakeholder review process and **provide opportunities for the public to contribute information, input, and ideas on the utility’s integrated resource plan, including the plan’s development methodology, modeling inputs, and assumptions, as well as the ability for the public to make relevant inquiries, to the utility when formulating its integrated resource plan.**

Each utility shall report its public outreach efforts to the Commission. The stakeholder review process shall include representatives from multiple interest groups, including residential and industrial classes of ratepayers. Each utility shall, at the time of the filing of its integrated resource plan, report on any stakeholder meetings that have occurred prior to the filing date.

IRP Schedule and Stakeholder Process



- Providing multiple opportunities for stakeholder input during the IRP process.
- Capturing a wide spectrum of stakeholder input, reflecting the diverse interests and perspectives of parties involved.
- Carefully considering all input provided.
- Meeting all legislative, regulatory, and operational requirements.
- Maintaining focus on 24x7x365 reliability.
- Responding to questions relevant to the 2024 IRP provided they do not involve highly sensitive or confidential information.
